




Redistricting: Why Did District Lines Change?

- 2010 Census Population changes affect federal, state and local representation.
- An Agency moves from elections at large for the whole district to elections by divisions or wards.






State Line Changes

- Assembly lines in Tulare County
 - From three Assembly Districts, the 30th, 31st, & 34th.
 - To two Assembly Districts, the 23rd & 26th.


State Line Changes, cont.

- State Senate lines in Tulare County
 - From 2 State Senate Districts, the 16th and 18th.
 - To 3 State Senate Districts, the 8th, 14th and 18th.




Federal Line Changes


- Congressional lines in Tulare County
 - From one Congressional District, the 21st.
 - To three Congressional Districts, the 21st, 22nd & 23rd.



How does this change Voting?

- Due to district line changes, voters may now have a new polling site or may not have a polling site at all because they are too small (under 250 voters).
- □ Voters without a polling site are called Mail Precinct voters and are automatically sent a mail ballot if the area they are living in is having an election.





Closed precincts for June, 2012, and after:

- □ Traver
- □ Poplar
- Crossroads Church (in Woodville area)
- New Harvest Church (outskirt area of Lindsay/Strathmore)

Other District Election Changes

- ☐ For the June 5 Primary the County has gone from 11,000 Mail Precinct Voters to over 21,900 Mail Precinct Voters.
- □ Some district lines are not final yet there will be additional voters who will lose their polling site in the November 2012 General Election, and become Mail Precinct Voters.
- There are at least 18 more school districts moving to ward elections in the November election.

New District Maps and Precinct Maps

- With the help of Quad Knopf, a local engineering firm, Elections was able to revise the district maps and make new precinct maps.
- We also included new name and numbering configuration for the precincts.

Renumbering – new precinct numbers

- New Numbers
 - 6 Digit Numbering System, from 5.
 - □ 1st Digit is the Supervisorial District.
 - □ 2nd & 3rd Digits are the City, with 99 being the code for the County.
 - □ 4th Digit is for the City Ward or Division, if they have one.
 - □ 5th & 6th digits are consecutive numbers to identify the precinct.

Renumbering – new precinct numbers

- ☐ The numbering starts at the upper left hand corner of the County, goes across and down, like a page in a book.
- The City ID now corresponds to the Property System's Tax Rate Area numbers.

- □ These changes will assist all who are looking at the Statement of Vote to identify their area of interest.

"Top 2" is New for California

- A Top 2 Primary allows you to vote for any candidate (for most races). Even if you are not in the same political party.
- ☐ The top 2 candidates the ones with the most votes in the primary — will be on the General Election ballot in November regardless of party preference.

Is Top 2 different than the last primary election?

- □ Yes. Top 2 is new. It became law in 2010 when Proposition 14 was passed. Before Top 2, each party could have one candidate on the General Election (November) ballot for all party races.
- Now with Top 2, only two candidates get on the General Election ballot for most races – the two who got the most votes in the primary – no matter their party preference.

What does party preference mean?

□ Party preference refers to the political party you – or the candidate – is registered with. It's listed under each candidate's name on the ballot. The word "none" appears for candidates who are not registered with a party. For example:

JOHN SMITH

Party Preference: DEM

JANE DOE

Party Preference: REP

CHRIS JONES

Party Preference: NONE

Do all offices follow the Top 2 rules?

- No. Top 2 applies to these voternominated offices:
 - U.S. Senator
 - U.S. Congressperson
 - State Senator
 - State Assembly Member
 - Statewide constitutional offices (such as Governor, which will be on the 2014 ballot).

Top 2 does **not** apply to elections for:

- □ President
- □ Party Central Committees
- County Supervisors
- ☐ City Councils
- Non-partisan Local Offices

Can the Top 2 candidates be from the same party?

- ☐ Yes:
 - Same party
 - Different parties
 - Or no party

If only 1 or 2 candidates run for an office, will they still run in the June 2012 Primary?

☐ Yes

I am registered with a political party. What will my June ballot have?

- Your party's candidates for President and possibly candidates for central committee
- All candidates from all parties for voter-nominated and nonpartisan offices
- ☐ State and local measures
