Supervisor's Message: County Continues to Fight for Funds



Tulare County's public and private sector leaders continue to fight hard on behalf of constituents through annual visits to Sacramento and Washington, D.C.

The purpose of these visits is to lobby on important Tulare County issues such as water and protecting agricultural land and to secure funding. Past face-to-face meetings with our state and nationally elected officials and staff have proven to be successful. For example, more than \$25 million in stimulus money was secured for the widening of Road 108 south from Visalia to Tulare after the annual One Voice visit to Washington, D.C. in February 2009.

In February 2010, a delegation of Tulare County public and private officials traveled to Washington, D.C. as part of the annual One Voice visit.

A transportation delegation requested funding and/or legislative support from federal representatives for projects chosen for their regional significance, their ability to bring prosperity to Tulare County, and their potential contribution to improved air quality and transportation mobility.

Some of the projects included:

Funding for Highway 198
and Highway 99 projects.
Promotion of a short-haul rail for the eastside of Tulare County.

- Continuation of air-quality funding.

In addition to transportation requests, members of the

Tulare County Board of Supervisors met with federal representatives to lobby for funding requests for the following items:

- Gang Prevention Initiative: \$517,500.

Lake Success Dam Seismic Remediation: \$10 million
Rural Community Water Systems: \$1.5 million

Program Spotlight: Ag Crimes Unit

The Agricultural Crimes Unit is a team of investigators dedicated to the fight of prevention of agricultural crimes.

The Ag Crimes Unit investigates any property crime against a farmer, rancher, agricultural-related business or other designated industry. Investigations generally take place in the unincorporated rural areas of the state and impact the victim's commercial production, distribution, or economic livelihood derived from agricultural livestock, petroleum, chemicals, farm implements and equipment.

The unit consists of three detectives and a sergeant from the Sheriff's Department and a Deputy District Attorney, and a District Attorney Investigator along with a part-time secretary from the District Attorney's Office.

Rx Prescription Drug Discount Program Launched

"AS HEALTHCARE COSTS RISE, PRESCRIPTION DRUG **DISCOUNTS WILL** HELP EASE SOME OF THE **FINANCIAL BURDENS LOCAL** FAMILIES ARE FACING AT A TIME WHEN THEY NEED IT THE MOST," SAID CHAIRMAN WORTHLEY.

Board of Supervisors Chairman Steve Worthley, the Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency, and Financial Marketing Concepts Inc., (FMC) launched a new Rx prescription drug discount program in February.

The new Coast2Coast Rx card will allow all Tulare County residents, regardless of income, age, or health status to participate in the program, which has saved cardholders an average of 38% on the cost of prescription drugs over the last two years.

Even family members that live outside the County and people's pets are able to take part in the program. The Rx card will be distributed free of charge and may be used at all pharmacy chains and most independent pharmacies in Tulare County and includes over 60,000 drugs in its formulary. "As healthcare costs rise, prescription drug discounts will help ease some of the financial burdens local families are facing at a time when they need it the most," said Chairman Worthley. "There are no eligibility requirements so the Rx card is expected to have a sizeable impact on uninsured residents."

Several counties in California, including Alameda, San Joaquin, and Stanislaus have established arrangements with Coast2Coast Rx, and the counties are reporting significant savings. "FMC is proud to assist residents of Tulare County to save money on the cost of their prescriptions," said Edward W. Rahn, President of FMC.

It is easy for interested Tulare County residents to pick up their Coast2Coast Rx card, with over 40 pharmacy locations throughout Tulare County, including big name retailers and locally owned pharmacies.

To obtain a card, residents need only visit a participating retailer, and fill out the accompanying paperwork, or print their own Coast2Coast Rx card by visiting <u>www.coast2coastrx.com/</u> <u>tulareca</u>.
